unfolds, parents often start monitoring grades to ensure that their kids finish with great success. One of the most common questions I'm asked by parents

and educators is how to respond to bad grades. The first thing to remember is that responsibility for the child's report card belongs to the child, not to us. Although it's

easy to get down on ourselves when kids perform poorly, it's very important for our mental health, and for theirs, to remember the following points. We can't learn for our kids.

and demonstrating excitement for learning.

As educators and parents, we can increase the odds of high achievement by modeling responsibility, establishing a safe and calm environment, providing excellent instruction,

## We can't control every action they take or decision they make. If we consistently demonstrate empathy rather than anger or frustration, the odds of our

kids overcoming their difficulties dramatically increase. Is empathy really that powerful? Yes, indeed! In fact, a growing body of research is demonstrating that warmth (i.e., empathy) is strongly correlated with higher achievement and better behavior.

Many highly successful people struggled with grades as children.

It's comforting to remember that some of the world's most successful people have struggled with grades. Albert Einstein, Henry Ford, Jim Fay, and Dr. Foster Cline are some notable examples. What's most important is that our children develop good character, curiosity, and problem-solving skills.

Remember to respond with sincere love and concern. Consider responding to bad grades by saying something like, "Oh man! I bet these grades are really disappointing for you. Please let me know if there is anything I can do to help. The good news is that this doesn't change the way I feel about you."
